Hope Conquers ACEs: What's Predictable is Preventable

Roger Sherman Roger Sherman is the Executive Director of the Idaho Children's Trust Fund, which is also the state affiliate of Prevent Child Abuse America. Under Roger's leadership, the Trust has greatly expanded its efforts to prevent child sexual abuse, introduced new ways of preventing Shaken Baby Syndrome, and engaged educators and others around trauma informed care and strengthening families. He has worked with schools and other organizations statewide in his current role and previously as a community organizer from 1979-2007. Roger was named the 2017 Child Advocate of the Year as the recipient of the Jerry Hirschfeld Special Achievement Award by the Idaho Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics. Roger is married and has three daughters.

Across Idaho, interest in learning to combat the effects of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE) is growing. While it is important to understand that child abuse, neglect and serious family dysfunction can cause toxic stress and are responsible for significant health problems, it is even more important to understand what we can do to prevent or mitigate the impact of ACEs. This presentation will explore both the prevalence of ACEs in Idaho and across the nation, and how Healthy Outcomes from Positive Experiences (HOPE) can be achieved through building resiliency and other protective factors.

Gender Dysphoria

Dr. Johanna Olson-Kennedy, Medical Director, The Center for Transyouth Health and Development Children's Hospital Los Angeles

This workshop will start with the basic concepts of gender work, including language, the different domains of psychosexual self, gender development in gender non-conforming children and transgender adolescents. Dr. Olson-Kennedy will review the medical interventions available for youth and cover some of the many ways that gender dysphoria might present itself from early childhood to early adulthood. Case reports will highlight features discussed in the lecture portion. Dr. Olson-Kennedy will review the DSM diagnostic criteria for a diagnosis of gender dysphoria in childhood and adolescence, followed by Aydin Olson-Kennedy discussing how gender dysphoria might present itself in other ways beyond those outlined in the DSM. The second half of the workshop will dive deeper into the nuances of gender dysphoria, starting with an interactive experience that highlights it's impact on the lives of transgender youth. Trajectories of trans youth development will be presented and highlighted with case examples. Dr. Olson-Kennedy will review common symptoms of gender dysphoria, and lead a conversation about how they are overlapping with mental health diagnoses. Recent data collected about the positive impact of chest surgery on trans masculine monors and young adults will be presented. Aydin Olson-Kennedy will wrap up the discussion with tools to help providers communicate more effectively with the youth in their lives experiencing gender dysphoria.

Suicide Prevention

Kim Kane, MPA, Suicide Prevention Program Department of Health and Welfare Kim Kane, MPA has worked in the field of suicide prevention in Idaho for 14 years. She is currently the Program Manager for the Suicide Prevention Program in the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare's Division of Public Health. Before coming to IDHW, Ms. Kane was the Program Director for the Idaho Lives Project, which focused on preventing youth suicide. She is a member and co-founder of the Idaho Governor's Council on Suicide Prevention and the former Executive Director of the Suicide Prevention Action Network of Idaho (SPAN Idaho). Ms. Kane is an experienced suicide prevention trainer. She is a certified trainer with the Sources of Strength youth wellness program and former trainer for the QPR (Question, Persuade & Refer) suicide prevention program, and has developed her own evidence-informed suicide prevention training. She also is trained in the Certified Psychological Autopsy Program from the American Association of Suicidology. Ms. Kane's bachelor's and a master's degree in public administration are both from Kansas State University. She lives in her hometown of Boise.
